Students may also apply for admission to the CP doctoral program directly following completion of a Master's degree. Students who have received their master's degree elsewhere or in a unrelated field must meet the basic requirements (30 credits) 10 of master's coursework. A review of remedial coursework required at the Master's level is normally conducted at student orientation.

Completion of the program typically averages approximately 5 years with a Master's degree and 6 years without a master's degree. Timely completion of all program requirements and progress through the doctoral sequence is expected of all students. Please see the "Recommended Course Sequence and Timeline" table for specific time frames for completion of program requirements. Progress through the program will be monitored annually for each student by the advisor
